Possessive Adjective Practice

Number of Players: 2 or more

Materials needed:

- one set of vocabulary pictures per pair of students

Instructions:

- Write on the board the possessive adjectives you want your students to practice.
- Put students in pairs with a set of vocabulary pictures.
- Each pair divides the pictures between them evenly.
- The first person begins by saying "my_____" for each item in Spanish.
 - Examples: mi camisa (my shirt), mis zapatos (my shoes)
- That person then begins saying the other person's items in Spanish.
 - Examples: tu blusa (your blouse), tus botas (your boots)
- The first person does this for all the cards and points while saying each.
- Then the other person does the same.
- Then, the two people should take some of each of their pictures and put them in a pile for an imaginary third person. They take turns talking about that person's things:
 - Examples: su perro (his or her dog), sus libros (his or her books)

To practice nuestro/a(s) = our, vuestro/a(s) = you all's, and su(s) = you all's or theirs, have pairs work with another pair to do the activity.

Examples:

nuestro libro (our book), nuestra bufanda (our scarf), nuestros zapatos (our shoes)

vuestro libro (your book - meaning "you all's" book), vuestros zapatos (your shoes - meaning "you all's shoes")
