Tell a Story Together:

Number of Players: 2 or more

Materials Needed: board to write on, vocabulary picture cards to use in one of the variations below.

Instructions:

- Create a word bank on the board of vocabulary and verbs learned so far. Have students help you think of words.
- Going around the room or group, first student says a sentence and then next student adds a sentence, and so on.
- Use the words primero = first (pree-mare-oh), luego = next (loo-ay-go), and por fin = finally (poor feen) to lead to next sentence.
- Keep the story simple and use dictionaries to find some words if desired.
- Do not worry about the story being all grammatically correct. Just get students started in putting sentences together.

Variations:

- Write the story on the board as it is being told. When the story is finished, the whole class reads it aloud together.
- Pass out vocabulary pictures cards, one per student. Each student has to add a sentence to the story using the vocabulary word for the picture in his/her sentence.
- Have students tell stories in small groups using a stack of vocabulary picture cards. One person should write the story as they tell it. Then each group can read their story aloud to the class. As the story is being read, you can have students from around the class hold up their picture of the word in each sentence as they hear it.
- Tape picture cards to the board and have students write stories individually. When they are done, they can read their story to another student. The other student points to each picture as he/she hears them in each sentence.
